Thoughts on the Readings for the Wedding at Cana January 19th 2025

Are you one of those people who 'feel bad about feeling good'? There are some, maybe more than we think, who seem to think that, in order to be a 'good' Catholic they always have to be denying themselves, or always 'making sacrifices'. If they go out to have a good time, they come back afterwards with guilty feelings. If they

think they are really enjoying life, there must be something wrong. They are being 'too worldly'. Yet, in today's Gospel we read a story about Jesus, his mother and his disciples taking part in a friend's wedding party. Do we feel that Jesus should have just attended the wedding ceremony (the 'religious part') and kept away from the festivities? Do we have a problem with Mary enjoying a glass or two of wine? Not only that, when the wine runs out, Jesus is the one who sees that there is a plentiful supply. In fact, he provides them with so much that they could not possibly have drunk it all.

One clear message of today's readings is that our Christian religion is a religion of joy. The genuine Christian really knows how to enjoy life. So many Christians have such a gloomy outlook on life and an even more gloomy attitude towards their religion. When you go into an average church on a Sunday morning, do you get the impression that this is really a happy bunch of people who have come to celebrate? For many people, religion, the Catholic religion, seems a terribly serious business.
